

**BY-LAW NO. 170**  
**A BY-LAW FOR THE PRESERVATION OF ORDER**

The Mayor and Council of the Town of Sackville enact as follows:

1. No person shall make any unnecessary noise by shouting screaming, fighting, swearing, singing or using insulting or obscene language.
2. a) No person shall operate any vehicle within the Town in a manner which is likely to create unusual noise or any unusual hazard or discomfort to other persons or vehicles.  
  
b) “Unusual noise” shall include squealing of tires, blowing automobile horns or driving with ineffective automobile mufflers.
3. No person shall loiter on any street or at the entrance to any public building or any building to which the public normally has access.
4. It shall be prima facie evidence of loitering that persons who are standing or sitting in such a manner or in such manners as to impede free passage to the public or to cause delay, or hindrance to any member of the public lawfully passing.
5. a) Any Police Officer who finds any person or persons congregating in such numbers or in such a manner as in his opinion to impede or cause to delay or hindrance to members of the public lawfully passing may request such person or persons to move.  
  
b) No person shall stand on any street or sidewalk or in any doorway or entrance after having been requested by a Police Officer to move.
6. No person shall stand or loiter on any school property, unless authorized by law or by invitation to be upon said property.
7. No person shall ride a bicycle on any sidewalk.
8. a) No person shall, without written permission from the Chief of Police or his designate, discharge any firearm within 200 meters of any street or any dwelling occupied or not, or any rifle within 500 meters of any street or any dwelling occupied or not, or any air gun within 50 meters of any street or any dwelling occupied or not.  
  
b) The Chief of Police before the issuance of written permission mentioned in subsection a), shall satisfy himself that the area and method of firing will cause no danger to the public, that the person firing and/or in control of such firing is qualified to do such firing and/or supervision.  
  
c) No person shall hunt on any land within Town limits, that is posted as per the provisions under the Posting of Land Regulations.

9. No unauthorized person shall carry any loaded firearm or air gun on any street or in any public place in Town.

10. a) No person shall discharge any explosives or fireworks in the Town except by license or permit from the Clerk.

b) The Clerk shall issue any such license or permit only on the recommendation of the Police Chief and Fire Chief.

11. No person shall coast or slide on a sled, toboggan, wagon, skateboard or other device on any street in the Town.

12. a) No person shall throw any object in or upon any public street in the Town.

b) Any person transporting excavated materials must ensure that all accesses to the area where the material is excavated or dumped and the public streets over which these materials are transported are maintained in a clean and safe condition.

13. No person shall injure or destroy any tree or shrub planted along any of the streets or within any public grounds of the Town.

14. No person shall remove, destroy, deface or damage any signboard or name plate or any written or printed notice lawfully affixed or posted within the Town.

15. a) No person shall solicit funds on a street within the Town for help in aid or money.

b) No person shall accost any other person passing along a street in the Town with the object of canvassing or inducing such person to purchase goods or merchandise, nor for the purpose of inducing such persons to give or subscribe money for any purpose.

c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this By-Law a person may solicit money for charitable and religious purposes if he has obtained permission from the Town Council authorizing such solicitation.

d) "Street" shall include streets, sidewalks, lanes, pathways, and any other property owned or controlled by the Town of Sackville.

16. Any person who violates any of the provisions of this By-Law is guilty of an offense and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not less than \$20.00 and not more than \$200.00, and in default of payment is liable to imprisonment in accordance with subsection 31 (3) of the Summary Convictions Act.

17. By-Law No. 90, A By-Law for the Preservation of Order and By-Law No. 90A, A By-Law Amending By-Law No. 90 are hereby repealed.

18. This By-Law comes into effect on the date of final passing thereof.
