

BY-LAW NO. 146B

A BY-LAW TO AMEND BY-LAW NO. 146
A BY-LAW OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF SACKVILLE RESPECTING
THE WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEMS

The Council of the Municipality of Sackville duly assembled hereby enacts as follows:

By-Law No. 146, A By-Law of the Municipality of Sackville Respecting the Water and Sewerage Systems is amended by adding the following:

Section 15.

Add: Subsection (12)

- a) When a customer whose water supply is metered, feels that their bill is not correct, they may make a written request to have the meter tested and shall also make a deposit prior to the meter testing being done. When testing the meter, it will be removed from the property, replaced by an idler and then be sent in to be tested by a qualified independent company. The deposit amount shall be as follows:

| 5/8" or 3/4" Meter | \$75.00 |
| 1" or 1 1/2" Meter | \$100.00 |
| 2" Meter | \$200.00 |
| 3" Meter and Above | \$300.00 |
- b) Where the test indicates that the meter is over-registering by more than one point five per cent (1.5%) above the standards set by the American Water Works Association as same exists from time to time, the deposit shall be refunded and the serviced customer's water bills during the previous 12 months shall be adjusted accordingly.
- c) Where the test indicates that the meter is not over-registering by more than one point five per cent (1.5%) above the standards set by the American Water Works Association as same exists from time to time, the deposit shall be forfeited to the Town and the original tested meter will be reinstalled in the customers property. In this instance, if the actual cost of testing the meter exceeds the cost of the deposit, the Customer shall be billed the difference in costs.


- d) The Municipality may at any time perform testing of meters 1 1/2" and larger when in the opinion of the Town the meter requires testing to ensure it's accuracy. Customers will be notified at least 30 days prior to the testing date and will be required to ensure all valves are in proper working order prior to this test. If the test is unable to be done on the scheduled date because of faulty valves, the customer will be billed the sum of \$100. In this instance only the cost of the test will be done at the expense of the Municipality.

This By-Law shall come into force and take effect on the day of final passing thereof.
